NEW ADVOCACY BLOG NOW ONLINE FOR NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGES

What is a BLOG? A BLOG is a user-generated website where entries are made in journal and displayed in a reverse chronological order. BLOGS often provide commentary or news on a particular subject, such as food, politics, or local news; some function as more personal online diaries. This one is all about National Wildlife Refuges.

Go to: <http://nationalwildliferefugeadvocacy.blogspot.com/> to visit this new online journal about national wildlife refuges. Once there, choose "BLOG" on the menu bar near the top of the first page to see the existing entries. It only takes a few minutes to explore the web site and to learn more about it. This is a work in progress. The entries feature discussion of current issues of the National Wildlife Refuge System as well as the accomplishments of the men and women who manage national wildlife refuges. "Blogger" Ed Crozier is open to suggestions for changes/improvements. Occasionally, there may be entries about the outdoors, including fishing, hunting, and other related subjects. Check it out and bookmark it in your browser. Periodically check back to see what new items may have been posted. Guest blogs and commentary are welcome. The first guest has posted her comments on the National Bison Range and the current threat to the National Wildlife Refuge System that exists there

The guidelines for submitting guest items and the contributions of ideas and issues for new topics are in the site archive. Go to <http://nationalwildliferefugeadvocacy.blogspot.com/> then select "BLOG" on the menu bar near the top of the "Welcome" page and then go to "Archive." You will find the guidelines in the first entry or the last item in the archive.
